Do you know the meaning behind Epiphany?

As you read this, we are now in 2024 – the presents have been opened, the puddings eaten and lots of TV has been watched! It truly feels like Christmas has been and gone for another year. Through this period, or at any other time, have you heard someone say to you they've had an epiphany, when they've just realised something?

'Epiphany' comes from the Greek word meaning 'to reveal', as it is when the baby Jesus was 'revealed' to the world. This is why you might hear people say they've had an epiphany when they've just realised something.

We have celebrated Christmas, which is an important date, however, for many of us 6th January also marks an important date for many people in the Christian calendar – that's because it's the date of Epiphany, which falls 12 days after Christmas. Since, at least, the third century, this day has been separate from Christmas. Epiphany is also known as "Theophany" in Eastern Christian tradition. The traditional date for the feast is 6th January. However, since 1970, the celebration is held in some countries on the Sunday after 1st January. In many Western Churches the eve of the feast is celebrated as Twelfth Night (Epiphany Eve). The Monday after Epiphany is known as Plough Monday.

Epiphany is also known as 'Three Kings Day' as it celebrates the three kings or the maji, who visited infant Jesus after his birth. The history of this day revolves around the adoration of the three wise men, or maji, who followed a star to Bethlehem to honour Christ's birth.

This day is celebrated in many countries around the world, including Spain, Mexico and Puerto Rico.

In Sweden as well as in Italy, it is a public holiday. In the Philippines as well as 'Three Kings Day' it is known as 'Feast of the



Elderly', and people greet each other with "Happy Three Kings!"

Popular Epiphany customs include Epiphany singing, chalking the door, having one's house blessed, consuming Three Kings Cake, winter swimming as well as attending church services.

Uplifting Epiphany prayers are given and I will end with one from Matthew 2:1-2

'Dear Lord, You are a gracious God as you freely gave Your gift of salvation. I will be forever thankful for the bright shining star that You sent not only for the Wise Men but for me that I may too have a deep and meaningful relationship with You. I pray that Your light will continue to shine so that others will also have the opportunity to receive Your gift of salvation and be transformed into a new creation.'
